ABOUT THE CAMARGO FOUNDATION

The Camargo Foundation, located in Cassis, France, and founded in 1967 by artist and philanthropist Jerome Hill, is a residential center offering programming in the Arts and Humanities. It offers time and space in a contemplative environment to think, create, and connect.

Located in Cassis, a small town of the South of France, facing the Mediterranean Sea, the Foundation offers a quiet campus surrounded by the natural landscape of Cap Canaille and the Calanques National Park. At the same time, Camargo is only a forty-five minute drive from Marseille, and a short drive from Aix-en-Provence and Arles, which are major centers for arts, culture, and research.

ABOUT THE CAMARGO CORE PROGRAM

The Camargo Core Program offers six, eight, and eleven week residencies to:

• **Scholars and Thinkers**

Scholars and thinkers in the Arts and Humanities should be working in French and Francophone cultures, including but not limited to cross-cultural studies that engage the cultures and influences of the Mediterranean region. Thinkers include professionals and practitioners in creative fields such as curators, critics, urban planners, independent scholars, etc.

• **Artists**

Artists, in all disciplines, who are the primary creators of a new work/project. The Camargo Core Program encourages multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary approaches.

Applications are welcome from all countries, nationalities, and career levels.

STIPEND

Fellows will receive a stipend of 1000USD/month and coverage of basic travel expenses to and from Cassis.

RESIDENCY PERIODS

This call is for two residency periods:

• **Fall 2017**

8 weeks from September 5 to October 31

• **Spring 2018**

6 weeks from February 27 to April 10

8 weeks from February 27 to April 24

11 weeks from February 27 to May 15

RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must be **fluent in English**.
